This addendum issued September 28, 2017 becomes in its entirety a part of the Request for Proposals IFB #2017-21 as is fully set forth herein:

Item 1: Q: Is there any way to get a list of the ACT 3 people/companies for this upcoming bid?

A: An answer to this question can only be provide once the acronym and phrase "ACT 3 people/companies" has been clarified.

Item 2: Q: It appears to be missing the front end documents for Division 00.

A: Front end documents 000110 Table of Contents, and 000115 List of Drawings were issued in the bid set dated 8/11/2017.

Item 3: Q: Also the spec files appear to have double specification sections for Division 22, 23 and 26. I am not sure if they are exact copies, but for example there are two sections labeled furnace 23 54 00 and two sections of 220500 with some being around page 430 and again at 787. Please clarify.

A: Specifications Divisions 22, 23, 26, 28 and 32 have been duplicated in the specification book. Pages 787 thru 1143 should be deleted from the specification book, as they are exact duplications of pages 425 thru 786. Furthermore, no specifications were issued in any addenda, except the sections listed below have been issued in Addendum 2:

- 1. 000115 List of Drawings
- 2. 012200 Unit Prices
- 3. 012300 Alternates

Item 4: Refer to Attachment C, "Task Order Contract No. 33, Addendum No. 4 Glen Hazel RAD, Allies & Ross Management and Development Corporation, R3A Project No. 15074B" for additional changes to the Bidding Documents. All items described become a part of

the Project and are governed by the general provisions of Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions and Division 1 Specifications Sections.

Item 5: Please find attached an updated Prevailing Wage Determinations in Attachment D.

Item 6: Each Prime Contractor solicited in IFB #2017-21 – E-P-H will be required to adhere to the HUD Safe Harbor guidelines for Construction as follows: six percent (6%) for General Conditions, two percent (2%) for Overhead, and six percent (6%) for General Conditions.

Item 7: Changes to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Form 5370 General Conditions for Construction Contracts – Public Housing Programs is as follows:

- Section 25. Contract period: 365 calendar days will replace 455 calendar days
- Section 33. Liquidated Damages: The sum of the Liquidated Damages is \$300 million.
- Section 36. Insurance: The "not less than" amounts found in Sub-Sections
 (a) (2) and (3) refer bidders to the AIA A101 document for the respective
 insurance limits.

Item 8: Q: Spec section 23 54 00 for furnaces section 2.1 K refers to "Breechings, Chimneys, and Stacks" specification section. No such section existing in the table of contents. Please advise.

A The reference to 23 54 00 should be removed as the breeching and stacks should not need to be replaced.

Item 9: Q: Are the existing chimneys properly lined or is a new flue liner required?

A: A new flue is not required.

Item 10: The Proposal due date is changed to October 12, 2017, and the time and location remain unchanged at 2:00 p.m., at HACP Procurement Dept., 100 Ross St. 2nd Floor, Suite 200, Pittsburgh, PA 15219.



1.1 GENERAL SPECIFICATION MANUAL

A. Clarification: Specifications Divisions 22, 23, 26, 28 and 32 have been duplicated in the specification manual. Please take the action as required by this revision: Delete Pages 787 thru 1143.

- A. Page No. 4, 3.3 Plumbing Prime Contractor Schedule of Alternates, A.
 - 1. Alternate No. P-001: Bathtub: Please take the action as required by this revision.
 - a. Add: "Refer to Alternate G-011 for GC Scope of Work for Coordination."
 - b. Replace Paragraph 1 with: "Base Bid: Replace (1) existing enameled steel bathtub and strainer in kind with HACP and Architect approved enameled steel bathtub within standard unit 517 of the Bernice Crawley High Rise. Replacement is due to crack or discoloration of existing bathtub. Plumbing Contractor responsible to remove sealant prior to tub removal from walls and floors. PC to include cutting drywall in level and straight lines to the face of the stud nearest to tub at an area of 250 sq inches at each side or a total of 500 square inches total for tub replacement. PC to cut existing VCT flooring in a straight line/parallel with the existing flooring seam and no more than 2" from the bathtub face along the entire 60" width, to allow removal of tub without lifting additional floor tiles being used as a sub-base. (No other bathtub replacements are within the base bid.)
 - c. Replace Paragraph 2 with: "Alternate: Repair Bathtub in Place. Do Not replace Bathtub in Base Bid."

The tank and piping are associated with a former emergency generator located adjacent to the Bernice Crawley High Rise. No report of leakage or spillage is on record per the report. The tank is not required to be registered with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP). Removal shall be in accordance with applicable local, state and federal codes, regulations and law. Registration of the tank with the PADEP is not required; however, the tank should be removed per PADEP UST Tank Closure procedures, including proper confirmatory sampling. Preparation and submittal of a UST closure report is required. The report should be provided to HACP.

Any liquid inside the tank should be removed and properly disposed. If localized impacted soils are found during removal of the tank, they should be segregated from obvious non-impacted soils. The potentially impacted soils along with the excavation confirmatory samples shall be tested by the Owner's Consultant. The tank excavation pit should be properly backfilled and compacted with clean materials following removal of the tank. General Contractor is to verify dimensions and outline of the paved asphalt surface prior to removal, and that in which is removed as part of the UST removal process and shall be replaced in the same shape and grade. Include wedge curb. Refer to Bituminous Detail 6 on L-310A. General Contractor is to verify dimensions and outline of the landscaped surface area prior to removal, and that in which is removed as part of the UST removal process and shall be replaced in the same shape and grade and covered with mulch. Any plantings shall be removed, salvaged and protected, and replanted.

Underground Storage Tank (UST) is identified within the Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment Report completed by PSI on March 27, 2017. A copy can be obtained

from HACP upon request. Post-removal testing will be conducted by the Owner's Consultant PSI.
